Accept with Edits

The contribution and contents of the manuscript have been accepted, but there is a need for the authors to correct the wording of some portions of the manuscript.

Minor Revision

The manuscript is viewed as having a high potential for publication in CTRJ. However, small, but important, content changes are needed for clarification and to strengthen the manuscript.

Major Revision

The manuscript is viewed as appropriate for CTRJ but there are major concerns with the manuscript that need to be corrected to enable acceptance.

Risky Revision

The content of the manuscript is seen as potentially important for CTRJ readers. However, there is risk in providing a revision decision either because though the problems with the manuscript are identifiable the means to revise are uncertain and unclear or because there is substantial risk that the revision may result in a reject decision because of the lack of clear steps needed to take when revising the manuscript.

Straight Reject

The manuscript is viewed as not contributing to CTRJ. The manuscript is too weak or has major flaws in several areas such as conceptual development and empirical work which cannot be remedied even with revisions. A manuscript will be rejected after a revision if the majority of reviewer and editor suggested changes were not made or if the revision resulted in major flaws to the manuscript.
