

Job announcement: Language Editor for interdisciplinary journal on social security



The *European Journal of Social Security* (EJSS) is looking for a highly-skilled Language Editor.

The Journal is an interdisciplinary journal covering the areas of law, social policy, sociology, and economics, with a particular focus on social security. It is published quarterly by SAGE publications. Two Language Editors are tasked with completing a thorough language check of all accepted material as part of the proofreading and publishing process. They are also responsible for ensuring consistency in style (including references) across all articles published in the Journal.

The ideal candidate will have excellent English language skills that are functionally equivalent to a native British English speaker and will be familiar with research in the field of social security. It would be advantageous to have completed (or be working towards the completion of) a PhD within the field covered by the Journal.

Excellent attention to detail, teamwork skills, flexibility, and the ability to meet strict deadlines are required. The expected workload is approximately 250 pages of editing spread across the year, with peaks around January, April, July, and October in line with the publication cycle of the Journal.

As a Language Editor, the successful candidate will be part of the editorial team of EJSS and will be listed in that capacity on the EJSS website (<https://journals.sagepub.com/editorial-board/EJS>). The work will be done on a freelance basis and remuneration will be paid per page. The rate is £3.76 per manuscript page (1 MS page = 350 words or 1 table) and covers the copyediting and proofreading of each article. The contract will be with SAGE.

To apply, please submit your CV and a written personal statement (maximum 1,000 words) to the Editors of the journal by **16 May 2022** at the latest.
