



Call for Editors: New Editor(s) for International Journal of Discrimination and the Law

SAGE announces the search for a new Editor or Editors of our journal, the *International Journal of Discrimination and the Law*. This peer-reviewed, scholarly periodical has published since 1995, since 2000 on a quarterly basis. We are currently accepting editor applications for a term of a minimum of 3 years, commencing January 1, 2023.

The *International Journal of Discrimination and the Law* encompasses a wide range of areas of discrimination law including race and sex discrimination, the treatment of asylum-seekers and refugees, issues of immigration and nationality, discrimination on the grounds of disability, sexual orientation, trans status, age, religion or belief and ill-health, in relation to access to employment, housing, education and other services. The provisions and operation of anti-discrimination law and problems with existing provisions, processes and procedures are critically examined. Reviews of recent literature and decisions from any jurisdiction and reports and advance information on major conferences are regularly published. This is an international journal of value and interest to academic lawyers, practitioners, campaigning groups, organisations and policy makers.

The Editor(s) will be responsible for soliciting, reviewing, and making final decisions on submissions to the journal, and will manage all aspects of the publication and review process using the ScholarOne electronic submission and review platform. The Editor is expected to maintain timely and effective communication, advance journal performance, and work towards upholding International Journal of Discrimination and the Law's high-quality standard.

Applicants should have a distinguished scholarly record in the field and experience in academic leadership roles. Applicants should also possess strong organizational and management skills, the ability to work well with others, and a commitment to SAGE's mission: believing passionately that engaged scholarship lies at the heart of any healthy society and that education is intrinsically valuable. This means playing a creative role in society by disseminating teaching and research on a global scale, the cornerstones of which are good, long-term relationships, a focus on our markets, and an ability to combine quality and innovation.

Your application should indicate how you would manage the administration of the journal along side other responsibilities and how you would work with the incumbent International Editorial Board and the Cases, Legislation and Policy Developments Editors.

Applicants should send a letter of application which includes their vision for the future of the journal and a description of their qualifications for the editorship. Applicants should also include copies of their CV and documentation indicating prospective institutional support.
