



## Call for Proposals: New Editor of *The Journal of Environment & Development*

SAGE announces the search for a new Editor of our journal, *The Journal of Environment & Development (JED)*. *JED* was founded in 1992 by a group of graduate students and faculty mentors at the University of California in San Diego to provide an interdisciplinary publication alternative for emerging research and policy analysis on environment and development. Inspired by the 1992 United Nations Conference on Environment and Development (Rio-Conference), *JED* has served an international readership of academics, policymakers, and activists ever since. In an increasingly crowded field of disciplinary journals devoted to environment and development, *JED* maintains its leading role with high-impact articles that deal with a wide range of topics from authors around the world.

**We are currently accepting editor applications for a three-year term commencing January 1, 2023. Applications are due Monday, May 2, 2022.**

*The Journal of Environment & Development* offers policymakers, non-governmental organizations, scientists, academics, and the business community the international forum that combines cutting-edge academic research with practical policy analysis. The broad scope and interdisciplinary nature of *JED* are demonstrated by the wide variety of interests and disciplines of its readers and contributors from around the world, which represent cultural, geographic, and disciplinary diversity found in few other publication outlets.

Editor will be expected to work with SAGE to ensure high-quality peer review and timely and accurate delivery of manuscripts for publication. The Editor will be responsible for soliciting, reviewing, and making final decisions on submissions to the journal and will manage all aspects of the publication and review process using the ScholarOne (formerly Manuscript Central) electronic submission and review platform. Editor is expected to maintain timely and effective communication, advance journal performance, and work towards upholding *JED*'s high-quality standard.

Applicants should have a distinguished scholarly record in environment and development fields and experience in academic leadership roles. Applicants should also possess strong organizational and management skills, the ability to work well with others, and a commitment to SAGE's mission: believing passionately that engaged scholarship lies at the heart of any healthy society and that education is intrinsically valuable. This means playing a creative role in society by disseminating teaching and research globally, the cornerstones of which are good, long-term relationships, a focus on our markets, and an ability to combine quality and innovation.

SAGE provides *JED* with editorial support, but the institution that hosts the journal will also be expected to provide support for the Editor and the journal office. Your application should indicate the expected level of institutional support, which might come in the form of additional faculty release time, travel funds, summer salary, office space, utilities, the use of computers and other office equipment, support for a full-time Managing Editor, student workers, and/or other basic expenses.

**Applicants should send a letter of application that includes their vision for the future of the journal and a description of their qualifications for the editorship. Applicants should also include copies of their CV and documentation indicating prospective institutional support.**
