



Call for Proposals: New Editor of *Small Group Research*

SAGE announces the search for a new Editor of our journal, *Small Group Research*. This peer-reviewed, bi-monthly publication has been servicing the field in pursuit of high impact content since its establishment in 1970. We are currently accepting editorship applications for a three-year term commencing January 1st, 2022.

Small Group Research is a bi-monthly journal international and interdisciplinary journal presenting research, theoretical advancements, and empirically supported applications with respect to all types of small groups. Through advancing the systematic study of small groups, this journal seeks to increase communication among all who are professionally interested in group phenomena.

The Editor will be expected to work with SAGE to ensure high quality peer review and timely and accurate delivery of manuscripts for publication.

The Editor will be responsible for soliciting, reviewing, and making final decisions on submissions to the journal, and will manage all aspects of the publication and review process using the SAGE Track (ScholarOne, formerly Manuscript Central) electronic submission and review platform. Editor is expected to maintain timely and effective communication, advance journal performance, and work towards upholding *Small Group Research's* high-quality standard.

Applicants should have a distinguished scholarly record in the field and experience in academic leadership roles. Applicants should also possess strong organizational and management skills, the ability to work well with others, and a commitment to SAGE's mission: believing passionately that engaged scholarship lies at the heart of any healthy society and the education is intrinsically valuable. This means playing a creative role in society by disseminating teaching and research on a global scale, the cornerstones of which are good, long-term relationships, a focus on our markets, and an ability to combine quality and innovation.

SAGE provides *Small Group Research* with editorial support, but the institution that hosts the journal will also be expected to provide support for the editor and the journal office. Your application should indicate the expected level of institutional support, which might come in the form of additional faculty release time, travel funds, summer salary, office space, utilities, the use of computers and other office equipment, support for a full time Managing Editor, student workers, and/or other basic expenses.

Applicants should send a letter of application which includes their vision for the future of the journal and a description of their qualifications for the editorship. Applicants should also include copies of their CV and documentation indicating prospective institutional support.
