### **GUIDANCE FOR AUTHORS FROM THE EDITORIAL BOARD**

Thank you for your interest in *Social & Legal Studies*, an international journal of socio-legal studies published six times per year by SAGE. We welcome the submission of manuscripts that advance our aims, namely, the publication of 'theoretically informed and empirically grounded work, where diverse traditions and critical approaches within legal study meet. We particularly welcome work in new fields of socio-legal study, as well as non-western scholarship'. Further information on the Journal's history and remit can be found at:

Before sending us your manuscript, please consider carefully whether your research is a good 'fit' with our aims and scope, and review past issues of *Social & Legal Studies* which are a good guide. Bear in mind in particular that, as the name of the journal indicates, we publish papers that both address some aspect of law, and do so from a social science perspective. At the same time, we welcome research which may push the boundaries of what we have published in the past and indeed we encourage submissions which critically engage with material which appears in our Journal. You are also welcome to contact any of the editors prior to submission in order to gauge the Journal's likely interest in your work. Submission of your manuscript must be made via SAGETrack, a web based peer review system: <http://mc.manuscriptcentral.com/sls>

Manuscripts submitted to us are subject to double blind review. However, you will likely find that we are different from other journals in our processes for review and feedback. We have always viewed peer review as a collective endeavour. Hence, reviews are usually done by members of our editorial board, which is large enough to include specialists in most aspects of socio-legal studies. Where necessary, and especially for submissions from Board members, external referees are used. We believe that this results in highly engaged and carefully reasoned feedback to authors. It also greatly facilitates more rapid return of reviews. Furthermore, our Editorial Board meetings provide opportunities for us to intellectually engage with manuscripts, and we value the close relationship between authors and the Board.

We aim to complete the review process within six weeks and we always try to provide detailed, substantive comments and suggestions to authors. We pride ourselves on our *constructive* feedback which frequently encourages authors to push their ideas further in order to strengthen their research. We often suggest to authors that they revise and resubmit manuscripts which we believe demonstrate potential and fit within the journal's remit. In return, we ask that authors engage thoroughly with our feedback when they are undertaking revisions.

Once your research has been accepted for publication, it will appear OnlineFirst on the Journal's website as a version of record. This usually occurs within a month of acceptance. Hard copy publication then follows, and we aim for this to happen within a year.

Our publisher, SAGE, provides optional open access publishing via the SAGE Choice programme. Further information can be found at <https://uk.sagepub.com/en-gb/eur/sage-choice>. We encourage authors to consider whether they have access to institutional support which would allow their research to be made fully open access.
