



Call for Editor: *Youth Violence and Juvenile Justice*

Sage announces the search for a new Editor for *Youth Violence and Juvenile Justice*. *YVJJ* provides academics and practitioners in juvenile justice and related fields with a resource for publishing current empirical research on programs, policies, and practices in the areas of youth violence and juvenile justice. **We are currently accepting editor applications for a three-year term commencing after January 1, 2025.**

Emphasis is placed on such topics as serious and violent juvenile offenders, juvenile offender recidivism, institutional violence, and other relevant topics to youth violence and juvenile justice such as risk assessment, psychopathy, self-control, and gang membership, among others. Decided emphasis is placed on empirical research with specific implications relevant to juvenile justice process, policy, and administration.

Interdisciplinary in scope, *Youth Violence and Juvenile Justice* serves a diverse audience of academics and practitioners in the fields of

criminal justice, education, psychology, social work, behavior analysis, sociology, law, counseling, public health, and all others with an interest in youth violence and juvenile justice.

The Editor will share responsibilities for soliciting, reviewing, and making final decisions on submissions to the journal, and will collaboratively manage all aspects of the publication and review process using the ScholarOne electronic submission and review platform. The Editor is expected to maintain timely and effective communication, advance journal performance, and work towards upholding *YVJJ*'s high-quality standard.

Applicants should have a distinguished scholarly record in criminology and juvenile justice, and experience in academic leadership roles. Applicants should also possess strong organizational and management skills, the ability to work well with others, and a commitment to Sage's mission: believing passionately that engaged scholarship lies at the heart of any healthy society and that education is intrinsically valuable. This means playing a creative role in society by disseminating teaching and research on a global scale, the cornerstones of which are good, long-term relationships, a focus on our markets, and an ability to combine quality and innovation.

Sage provides *YVJJ* with editorial support, but the editor's institution will also be expected to provide support for the editor and the journal office. Your application should indicate the expected level of institutional support, which might come in the form of additional faculty release time, travel funds, summer salary, office space, utilities, the use of computers and other office equipment, and/or other basic expenses.

Applicants should send a letter of application which includes their vision for the future of the journal and a description of their qualifications for the editorship. Applicants should also include copies of their CV and documentation indicating prospective institutional support.
