CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

<u>Arts and Humanities in Higher Education</u> is a peer-reviewed academic journal with an **Impact Factor of 1.00** published four times a year by Sage.

We are seeking a new editor who will bring their own perspective and energy to take the journal to its next stage. The editor will begin 1 April, 2025.

AHHE started publishing over a twenty years ago as a platform to serve the community of arts and humanities educators internationally, by publishing significant opinion and research into contemporary issues of teaching and learning within the domain. AHHE endeavours to promote re-conceptualisation of arts and humanities, and publishes articles characterised by profound thought about the interface between research and teaching, and the transformational purposes of a higher education.

Editorial responsibilities

- Determining the overall vision and direction of the journal in consultation with members of the editorial board and Sage;
- Communicating with, and reviewing, the membership of the editorial board;
- Maintaining a high standard of international excellence and a commitment to improving the status of teaching and learning within relevant Arts and Humanities fields in higher education;
- Determining the content of each issue, including commissioning of key papers and special (guest edited) issues;
- Working with the guest editors of special issues;
- Managing the flow of manuscripts, including reading submitted papers, managing the peer review process, making decisions about rejection, revision and acceptance, and corresponding with authors;
- Ensuring that publication processes, legal requirements (e.g. copyright), and deadlines are met;
- Promoting the journal internationally, including attending conferences;
- Keeping abreast of developments in the field and in academic publishing;

Essential Requirements

- A higher degree in a research discipline related to learning and teaching in higher education, ideally with interests in the arts and humanities.
- At least 5 years of experience in their field (as a professional or as an academic);
- International professional and/or academic links to scholars and practitioners;
- Experience of writing to a publishable standard in peer-reviewed outlets;
- A commitment to multicultural scholarship;
- Ability to work under pressure and manage responsibilities;
- Good organisational abilities;
- Strong inter-personal skills and ability to work well in a team;

Advantageous Requirements

- Experience in editing and publishing;
- Experience of using <u>ScholarOne Manuscripts</u>, either as author or Editor;
