

Call for Proposals: New Editor of The Journal of Environment & Development

- a letter of intent sharing your perspective on prospective editorial strategy for the journal, current strengths and weaknesses of the journal, and preliminary plans for the editorial board

Support can include additional faculty release time, support for staff or student workers, office space, the use of computers and other office equipment, utilities, other basic expenses, travel funds, and/or summer salary.
